Notes from Student Rabbi Elias

Chanukah oh Chanukah come light the menorah! Our festival of lights provides us with another opportunity for the light of our tradition to guide us into the future. One way to ensure the light from our chanukiyot stays in our eyes until the start of 2020 is to set a kavanah (intention) for each candle. By setting intentions we allow ourselves to be fully present while celebrating the dedication of our ancestors which allowed us to continue living our lives as Jews.

Following are a few intentions that we can establish this *Chanukah*: with each night's candle

With the lighting of our first candle we are moved by our Jewish values that teach us, "Justice! Justice you shall pursue!" and tonight we pledge to take action to carry out righteous acts.

With the lighting of our second candle we recognize that need to live by the value of *Sh'miat Ha-ozen*, a listening ear. From this value we learn the importance of listening to the need's others.

With the lighting of our third candle we recognize the need to love all of God's creatures equally. We pledge to live our lives while continuously remembering the value *Ohev et HaBriyot*, loving all God's creatures.

With the lighting of our fourth candle we recognize the value of being straightforward. We pledge to remember and actively live the value of *Ohev et HaMaysharim*, the Love of being straightforward.

With the lighting of the fifth candle we recognize the value of judging others favorably. We pledge to live the value of *Machrio L'chaf Zechut* by trying to see the good in everyone we interact with.

With the lighting of the sixth candle we recognize the value of empathy. We pledge to live the value of *Sichlut HaLev*, having a perceptive heart. When we remember that empathy breeds more empathy we truly understand the importance of this value.

With the lighting of the seventh candle we recognize the value of happiness. We pledge to live the value of *Simchah* and understand spreading happiness is just as important as our own happiness.

With the lighting of the eighth candle we recognize the gravity of the moment. Our ancestors lived the value of *Ma'amido al HaEmet*, setting others on the path of truth, which allows us to live a public and private Jewish life. We pledge to continue protecting our right to be Jewish.

While we do not know what exactly 2020 has in store, I hope that our festival lights can illuminate the joy that our future holds.
